Cosmetic products addressed in Annex I

Scope aligned with the Cosmetics Regulation

- <u>Rinse-off products</u>: soaps, shampoos, shower preparations, hair conditioners, shaving preparations, toothpaste....
- <u>Leave-on products</u>: creams, oils and lotions, hairstyling products, sunscreens, decorative cosmetics, deodorants...

Whe	ervak:			
(1)	Under Regulation (EC) No 66/2010, the EU Ecolabel may be awarded to those products with a reduced environmental impact during their entire life cycle.			
(2)	Regulation (EC) No 66/2010 provides that specific EU Ecolabel criteria are to be established according to product groups.			
(3)	Commission Decision 2014/893/EU (?) established EU Ecolabel criteria and related assessment and verification requirements for the product group 'rinse-off cosmetics'. The period of validity of those criteria and requirements has been extended to 31 December 2021 by Commission Decision (EU) 2018/1590 (%).			
(4)	In order to better reflect best practice in the market for this product group and to take account of innovations introduced in the intervening period, it is appropriate to establish a new set of criteria fee 'rinse-off cosmetics'.			
(5)	The EU Ecolabel Fitness check Report (*) of 30 June 2017, reviewing the implementation of Regulation (EC) No 66/2010, concluded on the need to develop a more strategic approach for the EU Ecolabel, also including the bundling of closely related product groups where appropriate.			
(6)	In line with those conclusions, it is appropriate to revise the criteria for the product group 'rinse-off cosmetice', including the expansion of its scope to other cosmetic products covered by Commission Regulation (EC) No 1225/2009 () and to animal care products. In order to reflect that expansion of its scope it is also appropriate to modify the product group name to Cosmetic products and animal care products' subsuming cosmetic products manufactured for human and animal use.

Criterion 2: Biodegrad ability

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- Limitation to the content of <u>non-biodegradable</u> organic substances (**aNBO**, **anNBO**)

Criterion 3: Aquatic toxicity and biodegrada bility

For <u>95% of organic ingoing</u> <u>substances:</u>

- o readily biodegradable, or
- low aquatic toxicity + not be bioaccumulable, or
- low aquatic toxicity + potentially biodegradable, or
- low aquatic toxicity + not be bioavailable



Reducing hazardous chemicals

Criterion 4: Excluded and restricted substances

- <u>Restriction</u> of substances with specific H classification
- <u>Exclusion</u> of carcinogenic, mutagenic or toxic for reproduction substances and SVHCs
- <u>Exclusion</u> of microplastics, PFAS, phthalates, endocrine disruptors, isothiazolinones
- <u>Exclusion</u> of **fragrances** in products for children or gentle/mild
- <u>Restriction</u> on **preservatives** and **colorants**
- UV filters not bioaccumulating or low toxicity



Reducing waste

- Small bottles are not allowed for <u>rinse-off products</u>
 - Secondary packaging is not allowed
 - Refills and recycled materials are encouraged
- Packaging cannot be excessive nor exaggerate residual amount of product in the packaging: PIR + R
 - Packaging materials <u>cannot be combined</u> if hindering recycling

Criterion 6: Sustainable sourcing of palm oil, palm kernel oil and their derivatives 100% w/w of such ingredients shall come from certified sustainable production, addressing environmental impacts on soil, biodiversity, organic carbon stocks and conservation of natural resources

Roundtable for Sustainable Palm Oil (RSPO)

Assessment and verification – key aspects

- The specific requirements are indicated within each criterion
- Documentation, declarations, analyses, test reports → from the applicant and/or supplier(s)
- Competent bodies shall recognise attestations which are issued by accredited bodies




As a prerequisite, the cosmetic product or animal care product shall meet all applicable legal requirements of the country or countries in which the product is placed on the market.



Who can apply for the EU Ecolabel?

- Producers, manufacturers, importers, service providers and wholesalers placing their products and/or services on the EEA market (the European Union, Lichtenstein, Norway and Iceland) can apply for the EU Ecolabel.
 Retailers can also apply for products placed on the market under their own brand name.
- Also products produced outside the EU can be awarded the EU Ecolabel, on the condition that they meet the criteria for their respective product group and that the product is sold in the EEA market.

- Prepare application dossier
- Submit your application

- Have your application positively assessed
- Be awarded with an EU Ecolabel licence

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

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


